

Sports Premium funding academic year 2017-2018

At Wayfield primary school we recognise the value of PE and school sport to the health and wellbeing of our children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children, to help them become well rounded members of the community. Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through entering into more competitive sports competitions, providing children with quality after school clubs, training children to become sports and playground leaders and providing teachers with comprehensive support in planning and delivering high quality PE lessons.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil; Wayfield Primary School will receive a sum of £???? (TBC November 2017) The government will publish the school level breakdown of funding for the academic year 2017 to 2018, including conditions of grant, in October 2017. This document will be updated accordingly. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see the money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools which will create a lasting legacy and positive impact upon the school.

Purpose of the funding Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that it should be able to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sports activities that the school already offers
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
