Communications and Language

At school we will :

- Retelling a simple past event in the correct order (e.g. went down slide/hurt finger)
- Using talk to connect ideas explaining what is happening and anticipate what might happen next.

At home you can help by:

- Encouraging your child to discuss past and present experiences.

Literacy

At school we will :

- Showing interest in illustrations and print in books and print in the environment.
- Recognising familiar words and signs such as own name and advertising logos.

At home you can help by:

- Looking at print such as child's name, words on a cereal packet or a book title

Expressive Arts and Design

At school we will :

- Building stories around toys, e.g. farm animals needing rescue from an armchair.

Using available resources to support this.

At home you can help by:

- Communicating with your child as they are playing about a story.

Physical development

At school we will :

- Children helping with their clothing, e.g. puts on hat, unzips zipper on jacket, pulls up own trousers.
- Can usually manage washing and drying hands.

At home you can help by:

- Supporting your child's growing independence as they do things for themselves.

Mathematics

At school we will :

- Recognising numerals from 0-5
 - Can match the numeral to a group of objects up to 5.
- At home you can help by:*
