Literacy & Languages

At school:

- We will be reading Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo and Zoo by Anthony Browne.
 - We will explore the work of prolific authors such as Chris Van Allsburg and Philip Pullman and compare how they use their writing styles to develop character description and infer character motivation.
 - We will use alliteration, fronted adverbials and clearly delineated paragraphs to link our writing.
 - We will develop our authorial voice by using a range of new vocabulary.
 - We will explore a variety of themes in fiction and non-fiction.
- At home you can help by:**
- Helping your child practice Year 5 spelling lists
 - Ensuring that your child reads for at least 10 minutes a day.

Humanities

At school:

- We will describe and understand the features of early civilisations such as the Mayans.
 - We will develop a chronologically secure knowledge and understanding of Central American history by exploring how the Mayan culture changed over time and influenced the world today.
- At home you can help by:**
- Create a written or iPad presentation on Mayan history.

Stimulus

Explore the wildlife in your local area and contrast how animals have adapted to their environment, predators and humans.

Maths

At school:

- We will review how to read and apply 12 hour and 24 hour time.
 - We will interpret data from a range of graphs including scatter, line and bar graphs.
 - We will learn how to interpret tabulated data and travel schedules and apply it to word problems.
 - We will divide fractions and learn how to convert improper fractions and mixed numbers.
 - We will compare and order fractions.
- At home you can help by:**
- Encouraging your child to practice their times tables every day with Times Table Rock Star (TTRS)
 - Supporting your child to use Mathletics to reinforce number skills.

Healthy Living

At school:

- We will be learning about sport and being active by focusing on invasion games and dance.
 - In our invasion games, we will be reviewing strategies, observing techniques and replaying a phase of a game whilst integrating our new learning
- At home you can help by:**
- Encouraging children to take photos of wildlife and habitats on forest walks.

Showcase

Hamilton class will be taking part in the Humanities Week showcase on Friday 15th February.

Science & Technology

At school:

- We will explore the living world through plants and animals.
 - We will learn about adaptation by looking at how mammals, birds and amphibians have adjusted to their habitats.
 - We will investigate how humans interact with the environment in different places around the world.
 - We will use our understanding of animal and plant life cycles to debate our role as global citizens.
- At home you can help by:**
- Encouraging your child to explore, interact and take photos of the natural world in their local area.
 - Talking with your child about the life cycle of a plant or domestic animal. How do they grow, mature and develop over time and what role does their environment play in this progression.

The Arts

At school:

- We will explore habitats and design our own bird feeders.
 - We will be able to express our thoughts and opinions about different pieces of art.
 - We will create a poster about the debate on whether zoos have a positive or negative influence.
- At home you can help with activities like:**
- Researching types of tropical and garden birds and identifying their feather colour, types of habitat and diet.
